- Loss of opportunity (people who know what AI is, will definitely replace people who don't know)







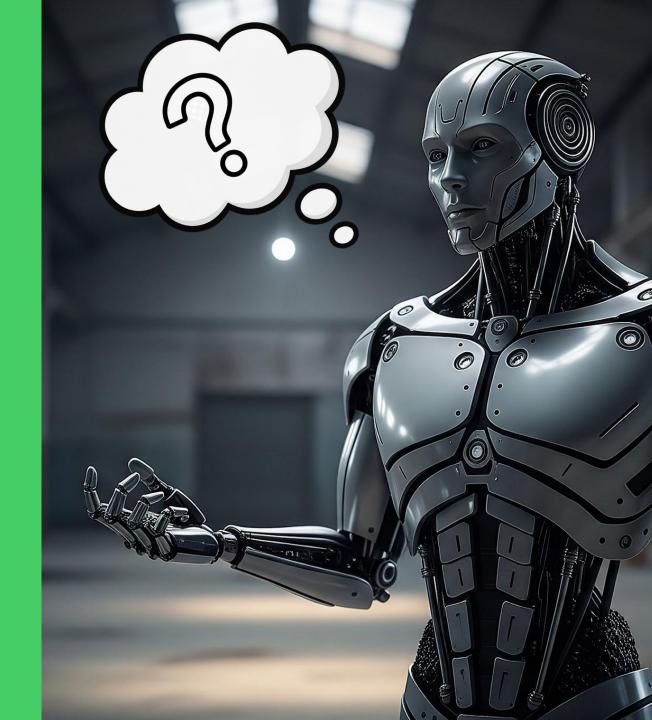
Not because I think you have a brain of a 10-year-old...

Can you guess what are the most likely word that fits in each box?

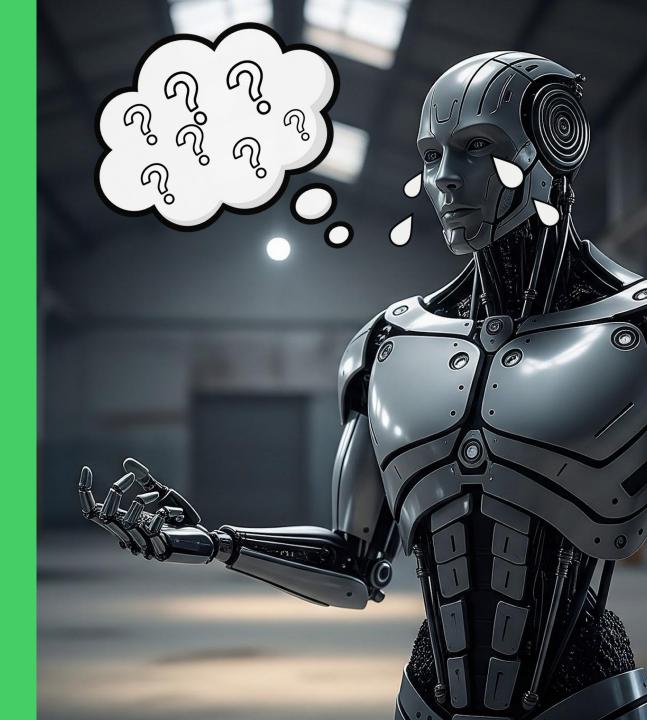


2. Al will never be 100% accurate, especially when you give little context.
